### **Budget Assumptions for 2020-2021**

- Continuation of flat state aid
- □ 2% increase in local tax levy
- ☐ Maintain current staff, programs, and services
- Consistent enrollment

## Why 2%?

- FLAT State aid = NO increase in State REVENUE
- Where do we get our \$\$
  - 2% Tax Levy Increase = \$478,070
  - Increase in Fund Balance = \$100,467
  - Total Revenue Increase = \$577,603
- Estimated increases in expenses
  - Salaries = \$526,000
  - Medical Benefits = \$111,600
  - Total Expense Increase = \$637,600
- Beginning budget planning already in a deficit of (\$59,997)

#### Additional Revenue Sources

- Federal Grants
  - Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA)
  - Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)
- State Grants
  - School Development Authority Alyssa's Law Compliance & School Security Grants
- Discretionary Grant
  - NY Jets Eat Right, Move More program Food Service

## Additional Cost Saving Measures

- Investigating feasibility of creating tuition-based special education program
- Analyzing district-wide subscriptions usage
- Maximizing opportunities for shared services

  - Preserve existing staffing levels
  - Maintain our facilities
  - Continue to focus on streamlining district operations in order to reduce cost

  - Replace two out-of-date buses
  - 54 passenger (#21)
  - 25 passenger (#18) wheelchair lift bus
- Security
  - 2-way radios
  - Security camera upgrades
  - Additional lighting
